
The city's multicultural weekend activities and events continued along with my time spent with my church family which grew in love and understanding through worship, praise and togetherness.



# DID YOU KNOW

Asbury and West helps approximately 10 - 17 people in our community each and every month with food vouchers (grocery gift cards) purchased through our offerings given to the Benevolent Fund when Communion is served (just four times a year).

With this demand we need your assistance as the Benevolent Fund is often low on funds. If you would like to help, please use the Benevolent envelopes that will now be available every Sunday on the narthex table. Give as you can.

As well, please note that the food cart is always available for your food donations. Kindly be guided by the following information:

#### Food Donation Items Most Needed

Canned fish and meats, canned beans, canned tomatoes, canned soups (low sodium preferable), canned vegetables, rice and quinoa, cooking oil, peanut butter, pasta and pasta sauce, flour, small boxes cereal (low sugar preferable), juice boxes, instant potatoes, <u>nut-free</u> snacks for kids' lunches, pudding cups, fruit cups, crackers.

#### Important Note

No open packages. Smaller quantities are easier to handle and spoil less quickly than large quantities. Items will NOT be given out with expired dates or if more than 3 months past it's 'best before date'.


Just a reminder to parents - we dedicate offering every Sunday and use it to buy supplies and other materials. Envelopes are available so please ask. Thank you for your support.


